YESTERDAY, a group of 15 children spent the afternoon at Ashford Hockey Club completing a carousel of fun hockey

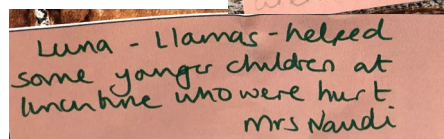
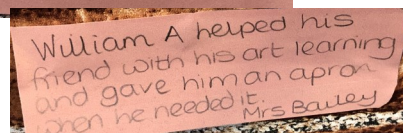
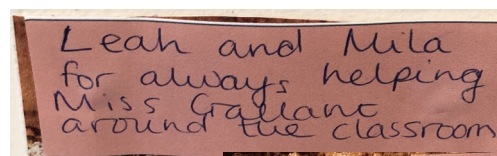

### School Lunch

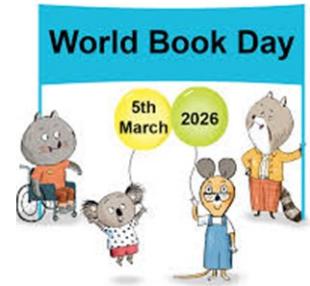

More details of what we will be doing to get involved will be coming soon!

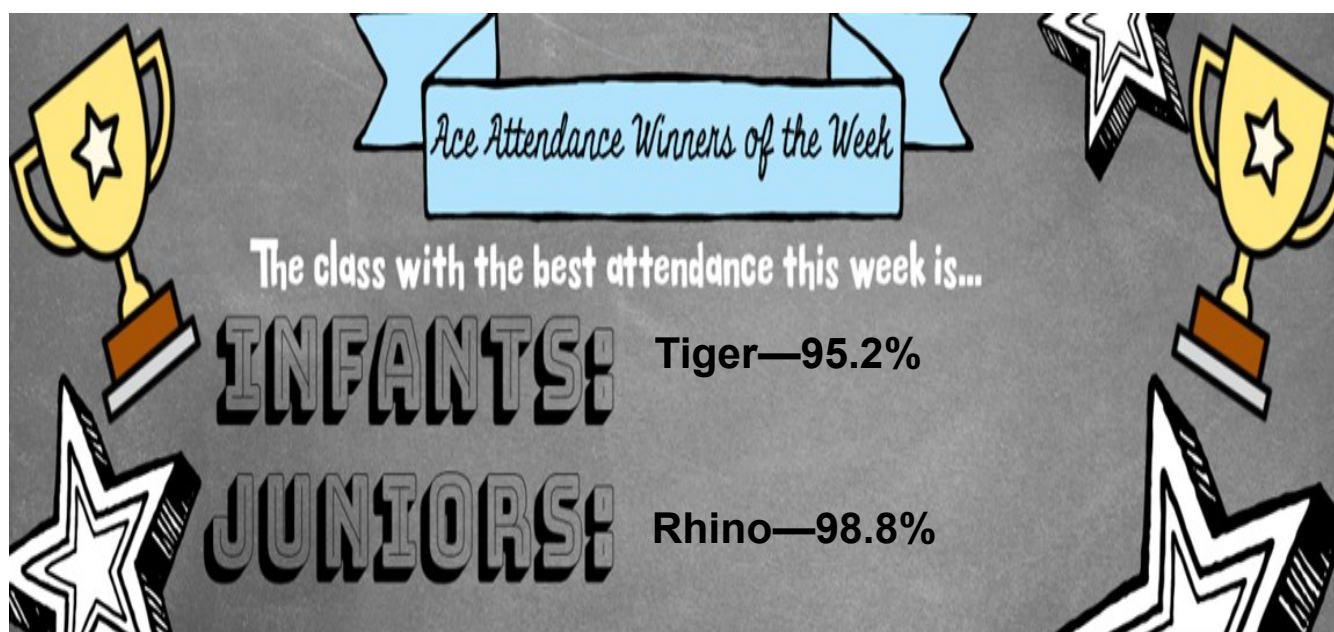




# Value Award Winners—Value: Compassion
