




The Odd Egg

Equal Access for ACE Girls



THIS week in collective worship, pupils reflected on the Bible story of The Feeding of the Five Thousand and our school value of compassion. We explored how Jesus noticed the needs of the large crowd and chose to act with care and kindness, ensuring that no one went hungry. “When Jesus saw the crowd his heart was filled with compassion, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So, he began teaching them many things.”


