- T**reating property carefully



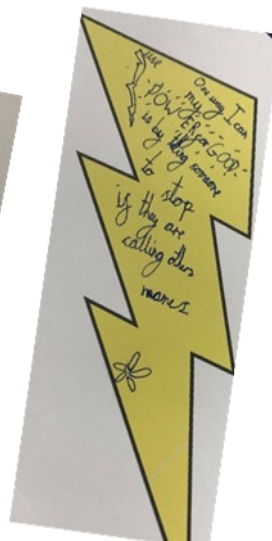
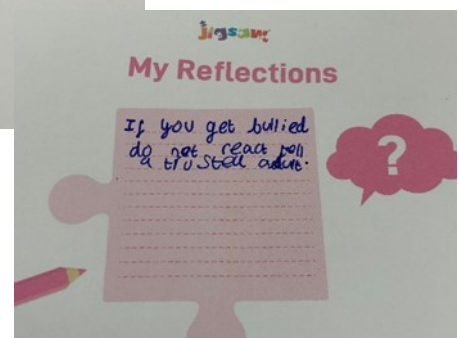
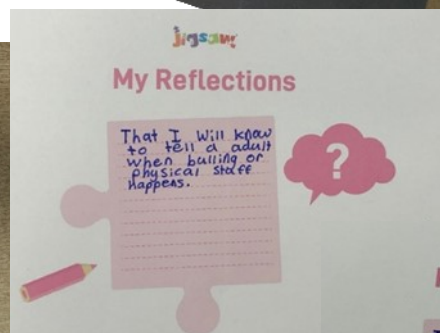
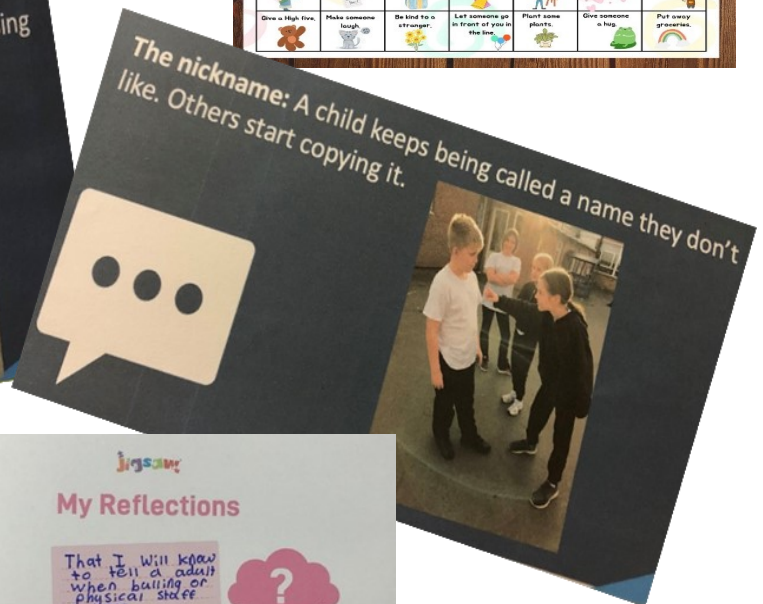
