The boy then boards the train, which is filled with other children in their pyjamas and nightgowns. They all sing carols and are served candies and hot chocolate by the train's staff.

The children were excited as they re-enacted getting on the train with their tickets and enjoyed a delicious cup of hot chocolate!

We can't wait to see your wonderfully Christmassy creations!












Christmas is Coming!
