Rainforest plants cover only 2% of the world's surface but make up 50% of species – vital to sustaining life on earth .

Sweet Angels Singing!

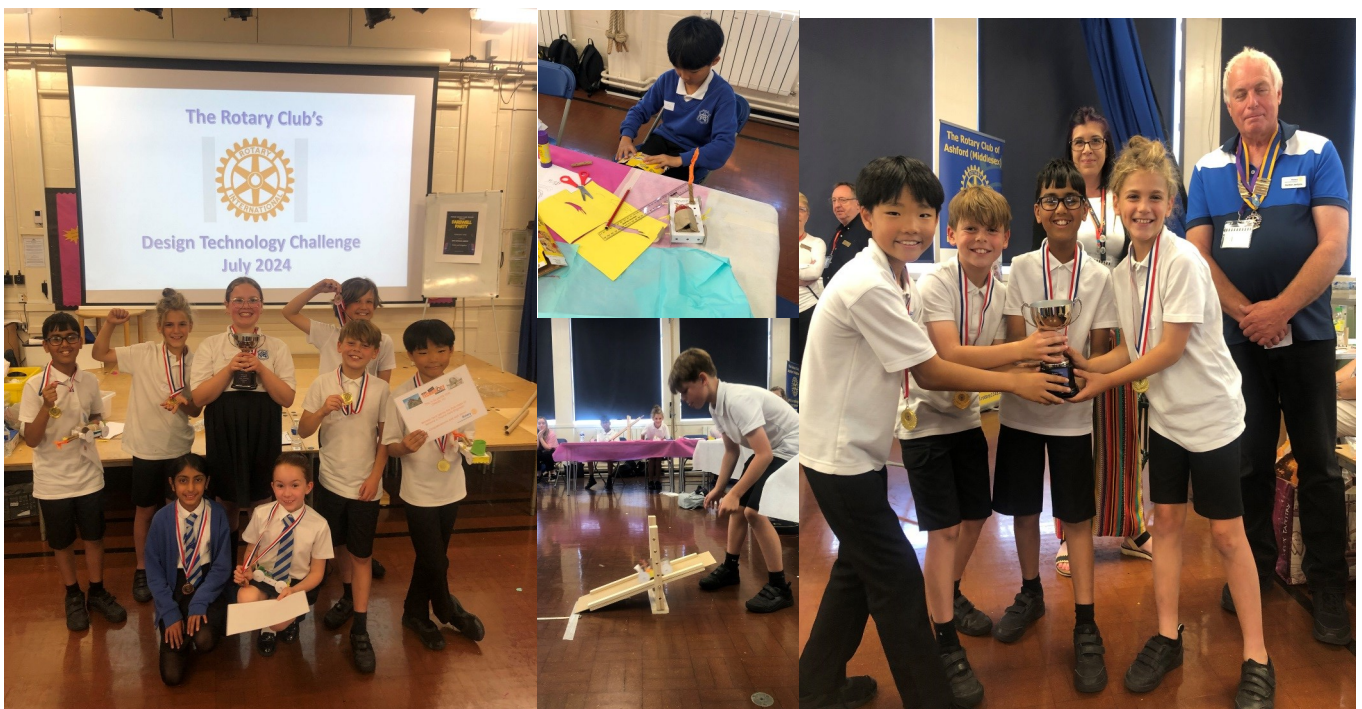
