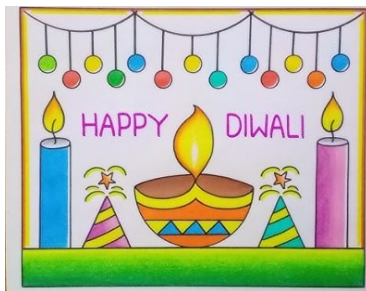
# The Great Anglo-Saxon Bake Off!

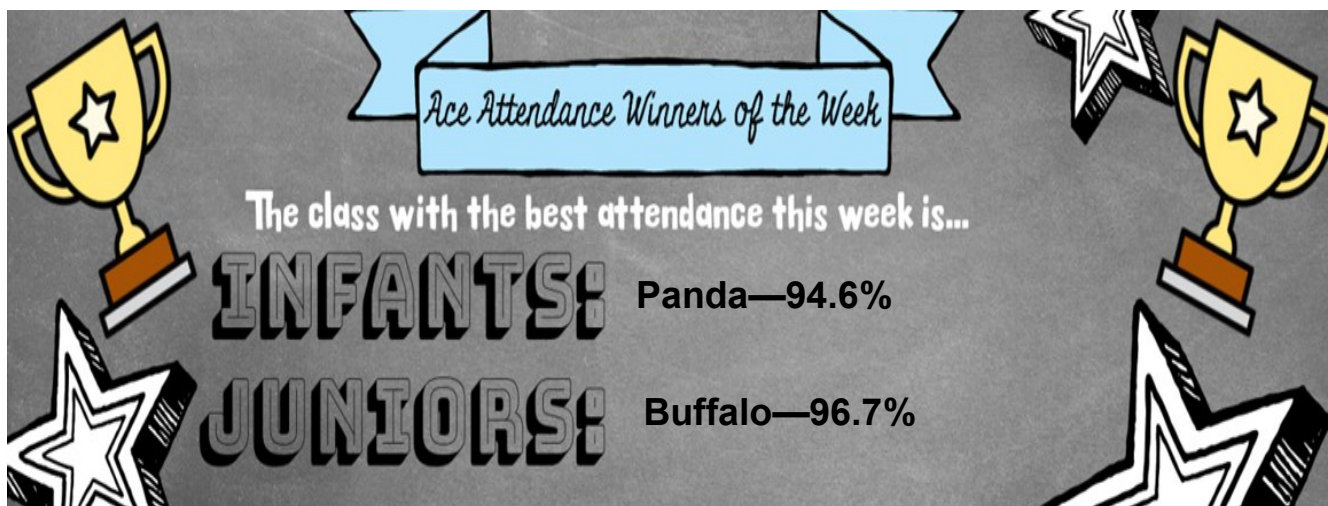
