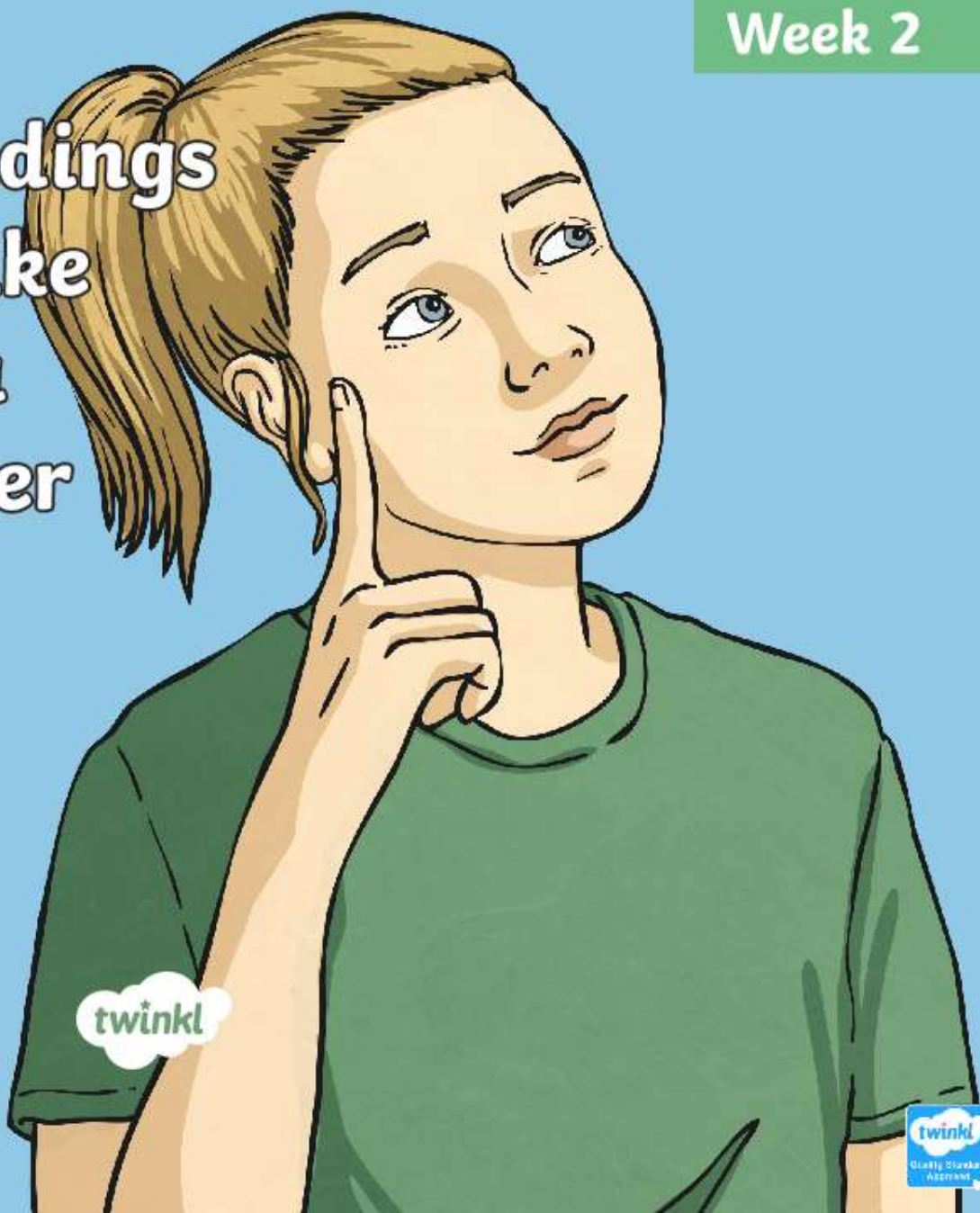



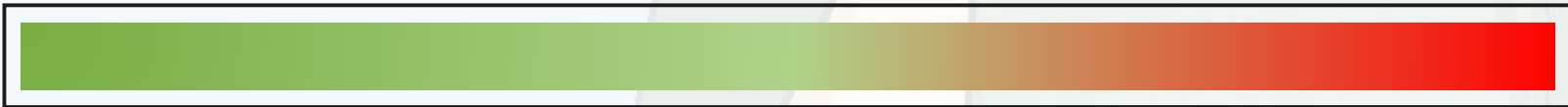
Words with endings
