Mr Whoops has accidentally jumbled up TWO adverbs that show frequency. Can you help him to unjumble them?

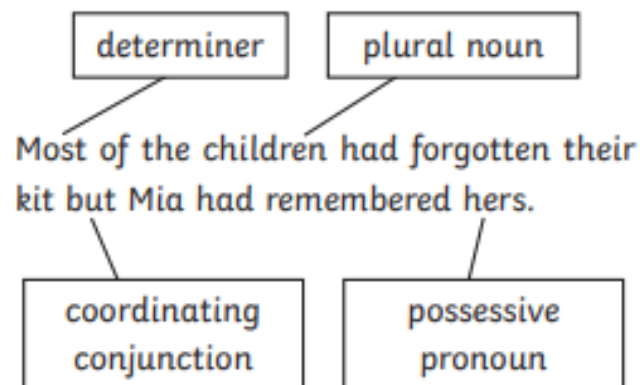
