 In the 1070s, William the Conqueror, fresh from his victory began to build a massive stone fortress in London to defend and proclaim his royal power. Nothing like it had ever been seen in England before.

The Tower of London

- The Tower of London was built as fortress, not a prison. It does not have cells or dungeons. However, because it was so secure it was used to house important prisoners from its earliest years.
- In Tudor and Elizabethan times it was mainly used for very high status prisoners or those accused of political crimes.

Escape from the Tower....

 A woman called Alice Tankerville is said to have been imprisoned in Coldharbour Gate by Henry VIII. One of her guards helped her to escape, the only successful escape in Henry's time.




