Some answers and suggestions for 'Sorting Adverbials'

- 1. Adverbials can be words or phrases. Fronted adverbials are followed by a comma.
- 2. Phrases can begin with a participle, walking, looking, waiting, etc.
- 3. Phrases can begin with a preposition, e.g. in, with, from.
- 4. Green highlights are place adverbials. Blue highlights are time adverbials. Yellow highlights are order adverbials.
